

He directs the Culture & Mental Health Research Unit at the Institute of Community and Family Psychiatry, Jewish General Hospital in Montreal, where he conducts research on culturally responsive mental health services and the philosophy of psychiatry. His publications include: *Healing and the Invention of Metaphor: Toward a Poetics of Illness Experience*, (Cambridge University Press, 2025); and the co-edited volumes: *The Mental Health of Aboriginal Peoples in Canada* (University of British Columbia Press, 2009); and *Cultural Consultation: Encountering the Other in Mental Health Care* (Springer, 2014). He is a Fellow of the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences and the Royal Society of Canada.
